The Right to Rescue Act

Bill Summary

AB 797 protects citizens from civil liability for necessary actions taken in good faith to rescue an animal from a hot car.

Existing Law

California law already makes it illegal to leave an animal unattended in a parked vehicle.

California's Good Samaritan Law protects citizens from civil liability for rendering "emergency medical or nonmedical care."

It is unclear, however, whether a person who breaks into a car to rescue an endangered animal would be covered by either of the above statutes.

Background

Every year, thousands of animals succumb to heatstroke in hot, unattended vehicles. The facts are staggering:

- Even on an 80° day, the temperature in a parked car can reach 120° in just 10 minutes.
- On a 90° day, the interior temperature of a vehicle can rise as high as 150°.

These temperatures are unbearable for any person, but especially for animals who do not have sweat glands like humans.

Precedent

In 2015, Tennessee made history by passing a similar measure – the first of its kind in the nation.

Other bills have been passed in Michigan, Wisconsin, Ohio, and Florida. Legislation is pending in New York and Massachusetts.

Need for AB 797

Many concerned citizens come across animals in need of rescue, but aren't sure what to do and fear being sued and/or arrested if they take unauthorized steps to free an animal.

AB 797 lays out the steps that a citizen must take prior to entering a vehicle with the intent to save an animal from extreme heat.

If those steps – which include contacting law enforcement – are followed, AB 797 would protect the Good Samaritan from criminal prosecution of liability for civil damages.
